### Past simple exercises - regular verbs - Agendaweb

Unlike irregular verbs, those verbs that form their past participle with ‘d’ or ‘ed’ are regular verbs. These verbs do not undergo substantial changes while changing forms between tenses. If the verb ends with a vowel, only ‘d’ is added. For example: PRESENT TENSE. PAST TENSE.

### Regular Verbs: A Big List of Regular Verbs in English ...

Regular verbs are called “regular” because they follow a regular pattern when switching between tenses. The present tense of a verb is the same as the verb’s base form. To change a regular verb from present tense to past tense, you simply add “d” or “ed” to the end of the word. The past participle form of a regular verb is the same as the simple past form. Both end in “ed.”

### Past simple - regular/irregular verbs - Test-English
